2415.04- TITLE I - DISTRICT-WIDE PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT POLICY (M)

Section: Program

Board Adopted: December 17, 2008

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Part I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Paterson Charter School for Science and Technology agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- A. The school district will put into operation programs, activities, and procedures for the involvement of parents in all of its schools with Title I, Part A programs, consistent with Section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Those programs, activities, and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
- B. Consistent with Section 1118, the school district will work with its schools to ensure that the required school-level parental engagement policies meet the requirements of Section 1118(b) of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with Section 1118(d) of the ESEA.
- C. The school district will incorporate this District-Wide Parental Involvement Policy into its school district's plan developed under Section 1112 of the ESEA.
- D. With these activities, our school aims to celebrate the multi-culturism and the diversity of students who is an English second learner and their parents. During these activities, information about the school and how parents can utilize school resources to enhance their students' education will be given. Based on feedback and input received from parents during various parent meetings, PCSST will provide bilingual interpreters for parents who have language barriers. Such bilingual interpreters will interpret during parent-teacher conferences, back –to- school nights, ESL Parent

Nights, Literacy Nights and Title I annual parent meetings. In addition, documents including parent notification letters, school reach, and website postings will also be translated in the languages spoken by our parents.

E. Paterson Charter School for Science and Technology will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this Parental Engagement Policy in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background).

Goals and Objectives

Workshops will be offered to parents to provide them as appropriate in understanding standards, state and local assessments and their child's scores, the requirements of Part A, and monitoring

their child's progress and working with educators. In addition, any other resources that will help them become familiar with topics listed above will be provided.

B. The school district will, with the assistance of its schools, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental engagement, by:

1. *Provide parents with student-parent handbook.*
2. *Provide parents with NJ DOE websites specific to academic standards, assessments, ESSA, and Title I Part A.*
3. *Literature will be sent home as a resource to parents to help them provide assistance to their children.*
4. *Parent workshops will be offered on literacy training and technology skills.*
5. *Provide parents with training on distance learning strategies and virtual communication platforms including zoom, google classroom, class dojo etc.*
6. *Information will about conferences and workshops that pertain to parents will be shared with parents via school's website and PTO.*

C. The school district will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, Principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

1. *An annual workshop will be given by Paterson Community members to the staff providing strategies for parent/school partnerships and effective parent communication.*
2. *Teacher-Parent Communication Logs*
3. *Utilize parent Volunteers*

D. The school district will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

1. *Mailing*
2. *Phone calls & text messages*
3. *School Reach*
4. *Emails*
5. *Postings on District Website and Student Information System(SIS)*
6. *Placing it on the informational parent table at the mains offices in each school*
7. *Translations of the meeting notices will be provided to the extent possible.*
8. *Schedule parent meetings at different times of the day vs only in the evenings*

DISCRETIONARY DISTRICT-WIDE PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT POLICY ACTIVITIES
